Theme-4: The Service Delivery Improvement Project (SDIP): A Practical Tool for Community-based Project Planning and Management

Brief description: Under the final theme of the course, **Day-7 to Day-12** will focus on useful practical tools (e.g., SWOT Analysis, PESTEL Analysis, Stakeholder Analysis, Problem Tree Analysis, Objective Tree Analysis, Risk Analysis, Vertical and Horizontal Logic of Log Frame) for designing a project related to address/improve health problems of community people. It guides participants to explore root causes of health problems through problem tree and stakeholder analysis focusing on community level health issues and finding an innovative solution to solve those problems.
