Media Reality in Bangladesh

Internationally, it is said that 'the media in Bangladesh is partial free'. Creative journalism cannot go its own way with constant fear in mind. This fear comes from multifaceted sources. We are talking about crisis, in fact all these are challenges in journalism. Journalism has advanced in all crises or challenges for ages. Times have changed, crises or challenges have taken on a different look. But journalism has not stopped but has moved forward with new brilliance.

By and large, the mainstream media in Bangladesh follows the broad ethical codes of the profession. But when a rare example of a rotten apple comes to the fore, it is cited as an example of how the whole media behaves. We have stood firm in supporting democracy, secularism, national sovereignty, illegal takeover of power, etc.

Journalism has loudly proclaimed and celebrated every success that our people and government have achieved. No credible example can be cited where the media took a position that was against the public interest. The differences in perception or definition or interpretation of what constitutes "national" or "public" interest between a government and the media are historical.

International Center for Journalists study said, 'Reporters saw disinformation circulate most on Facebook 66 percent, Twitter 42 percent and WhatsApp 35 percent. Underscoring the economic impact, almost four in five respondents with access to information about their newsroom's finances reported at least a 50 percent decline in revenue. Sixty-five percent of respondents said they have less job security now than before COVID-19.'

Similar situation is in Bangladesh also. Still media organiations and journalists in Bangladesh didn't able to address their respective economic vulnerability issues yet. In some cases , a tag of war is going between two parties because non-paying salaries and benefits of journalists by authorities.

Monitoring

As a part of our assignment of Bangladesh Health Watch, we have monitored six newspapers; these are *Prothom Alo, Kalerkantho, Samkal, Daily Star, New Age and Bangla Tribune*.

Prothom Alo, Kalerkantho, Samkal are national Bangla daily newspapers; *Daily Star, New Age* are national English daily newspapers, all five have print and online versions. There are three presentations of their online versions, i) real time updates ii) online daily newspaper and iii) enewspaper- a newspaper as printed one. Along with their bangla online version, *Prothom Alo, Kalerkantho, Samakal* have English online versions also. English daily *Daily Star* has bangla version also. *Bangla Tribune* is an online newspaper, which has two presentations- real time updates and daily newspaper. Credibility and readerships are major concerns in selecting newspapers for this monitoring.

Findings

All published items in six newspapers have been divided into two broad categories, A) issues related to Coronavirus and B) other health issues. We have identified 32 broad issues with 116 sub issues within issues related to Coronavirus and 16 issues within other health issues category with 18 sub issues. Published items have compelled us to redesign the list of issues in this month.

It is fact that readers are more interested about health issues due to Covid-19 pandemic. Newspapers have been trying to address that need. But their publication were more focused on tips and prescriptions related to health issues rather than presenting ground level realities. Prothom Alo has been publishing health issues in different format. Along with regular reports they have been promoting health related discussion by live online video broadcastings. They have been trying to present health guidelines to readers by experts. It is new phenomenon that pharmaceutical companies are sponsors of those discussions. Revenue of Newspapers has been decreased from traditional sources due to current situation. So, regular participation pharmaceutical industries as sponsors has added value in revenue generation through creating awareness on those issues.

Issues like as vaccine, second wave of infection and risks related to disobey of health safety code of conducts have been presented in due importance. Those issues got due importance by policy makers including Prime Minister and Health Minister also. Still insufficient efforts by respective government were discussed in reports, articles and online video presentations of different newspapers. But Prime Minister and Health Minister expressed their satisfaction related to performance of health departments in handling Covid-19. They presented fewer deaths compare other countries as an indicator of good Covid 19 management. Reopening of education institutions is another challenging area now. Suffering, uncertainty and vulnerability of students and teachers due to long closer of institutions were discussed. Still digital education didn't able to replace physical class room. Limited availability of digital devices and not upto the mark internet connectivity all over country specially country side were concerns of newspapers.

Summary findings

- High Recovery rate from infection, Deaths from Covid for comorbidity and Asymptomatic case and Antigen test kit are issues to present Covid Scenario of different newspapers.
- Need of Antigen tests and increase testing capacity for minimizing risks of infection by second wave.
- Vaccine, Second wave of infection and Mandatory mask use mostly ignored across Bangladesh were got more coverage priority in this month.
- Issued cover under vaccine were Trial, Co-financing for trial, Govt Vaccines scheme for arranging finance, enlisted Globe Vaccine in WHO list and trial of BANCOVID in Nepal.

- Fear and Preparation for Second wave were discussed in different reports
- Experts' are unsatisfied on seven months actions for Covid-19 Management but Prime Minister and Health Minister expressed their satisfaction in this regard. According to Samakal report, 'capacity of the health department to handle the challenges has increased'.
- Didn't able to make available Oxygen supply system as planned.
- Reasons behind Less infection in Rohingya camp like as Dhaka slums
- IEDCR study report on Covid 19 and Herd immunity created controversy, experts are not agree with conclusions of that report
- More reports on Mental Health issue; and improvement of existing facilities and increase number of professionals in this field were highlighted.
- As earlier, information on Corruption and Irregularities related to procurement of health department were also available in this month.
- Uncertainties of Migrant Workers related to Covid test, tickets and Vis; and metal pressure were issues of different reports.
- Reopening plan of education institutions and implementation of that plan simultaneously demand for stimulus package for institutions and availability of devices for online education for students were issues in different reports.
- Digital health services and good number of enrolment in this system for getting services were presented.
- Two issues i.e. Child marriage risks skyrocket and Medical Waste Management were also presented in this month
- According to study report of Bangladesh Health Watch, 'Covid patients have to spend Tk 12,000 each for medicine.
- A joint statement of Bangladesh Medical Association and Swadhinata Chikitsak Parishad for protesting recent deputation of Administrative Service cadre officers to health service providing agencies was available in this month.
- Prothom Alo published health tips under a section 'Bhalo Thakun (stay well) along with Sushasto (Good Health) and Q & A section on health issues by engaging different experts. Pro Sastho is their weekly special publication on health issues.

- Bangla Tribune organised and broadcasted a live programme on 'Family Planning in post delivery situation and protecting maternal health during Covid-19 under a programme titled 'Boitaki' (Discussion Programme).
- Daily Star's weekly publication 'Health', 'Daktar Bari' (weekly publication of Samakal on health issues) and 'Dakatar Achen' (weekly publication of Kalerkantho on health issues) published in this month.
- Newspapers covered other than Coronavirus issues also, which are a) polio vaccines redundant due to negligence, b) Mother and children welfare centres empty as no doctors, staffers appointed yet, c) controversy related to dress code of Muslim employees in the Institute of Public Health, d) demanding for independent institution for stopping drug uses, e) Controversy on New Born Baby in DMCH (Dhaka Medical College Hospital), where fact was like that doctor declared a baby was dead but later parents found that baby was alive, and DMCH authority termed that incident as 'no negligence of doctor, but fault', g) Seasonal fever and h) Breast cancer risk, misconceptions and prevention.
- Integrated efforts to face Covid-19 is necessary and on present situation experts said, 'here is no chance to think that the risk has decreased'.

Journalism in Bangladesh: current perspectives

Free and independent media is vital

Anis Chowdhury, Adjunct Professor at the University of Western Sydney and the University of New South Wales (Australia) said, 'Free and independent media is vitally important for both managing crises and protecting democracies. We are no doubt entering a dangerous era, and vigilance is essential. The Covid-19 crisis seems to be a bellwether of rising authoritarianism more than the virus itself. We need local mobilisation. We need to democratise politics; i.e., we have to go beyond press and election, and strengthen the rights of the working class to form unions or associations. We need mass political mobilisation to protect both democracy and press freedom'.

Decline in revenue of Media and less job security

International Center for Journalists released a study report recently. According to that report, 'The Covid-19 pandemic has severely impacted many journalists and newsrooms in one way or another across the globe. Journalists are working in a severely pressured financial, physical and psychological environment during the pandemic; 70 percent of respondents rated the psychological toll as their biggest challenge during the pandemic while more than 80 percent of respondents noted at least one negative psychological effect, including anxiety, burnout, difficulty sleeping and a sense of helplessness. Over 70 percent of respondents said that employers failed to offer flexible hours, time off, social support or regular check-ins etc.

That study report also said, 'Reporters saw disinformation circulate most on Facebook 66 percent, Twitter 42 percent and WhatsApp 35 percent. Underscoring the economic impact, almost four in five respondents with access to information about their newsroom's finances reported at least a 50 percent decline in revenue. Sixty-five percent of respondents said they have less job security now than before Covid-19.'

As a part of our assignment of Bangladesh Health Watch, we have monitored six newspapers; these are *Prothom Alo, Kalerkantho, Samkal, Daily Star, New Age and Bangla Tribune*.

Prothom Alo, Kalerkantho, Samkal are national Bangla daily newspapers; *Daily Star, New Age* are national English daily newspapers, all five have print and online versions. There are three presentations of their online versions, i) real time updates ii) online daily newspaper and iii) enewspaper- a newspaper as printed one. Along with their bangla online version, *Prothom Alo, Kalerkantho, Samakal* have English online versions also. English daily *Daily Star* has bangla version also. *Bangla Tribune* is an online newspaper, which has two presentations- real time updates and daily newspaper. Credibility and readerships are major concerns in selecting newspapers for this monitoring.

<u>Methodology</u>

- We read each report, feature, editorial, post editorial and article, interview and expert's opinion related to health issues published during this month in stated newspapers, and have compiled selected write-ups in a daily basis. Each news organization is active to update their portal real time basis. So, we monitor those updates also but our focus was on daily printed version only for this study.
- We have divided all published health related items in six newspapers into two categories- issues related to Coronavirus and other health issues. We have indentified broad issue/s or message/s of each published item and have developed issue based storage of those published items. Later we identified sub issues of those board issues. Compilation of the 6 newspapers are available here as per board issues with sub issues.
- Later we have developed overall newspaper coverage scenario on health issues for October 2020 on the basis of selected items which has representative value of that category. Links of published items are available here also, so anyone can get detail of that published item as ready reference during reading this report. So, it is now a monitoring report for disclosing issues for further work side by side a comprehensive publication on Health issues for October 2020.

Findings

Experts opined infavour of pro-active role of government for getting vaccine within quickest time. Government is active in this regard and asking funds from different international development agencies. Though home grown vaccine has enlisted in the WHO list but government is trying to get vaccine from major global players.

Health issues coverage by New Age, Bangla Tribune, Daily Star, Samakal and Kalerkantho decreased more than earlier months during pandemic. Less reports and articles were available in October even related to Covid 19 also. All of them tried to disclose information on vulnerability of people due to Covid specially people other than fixed income groups. Discussion on post Covid situation has already been started. Different experts and groups have been demanding need based stimulus packages for supporting small and middle business initiatives.

Bangla Tribune tried to maintain their own style of presentation which is short length report of one event. They have been presenting more reports of one event.

The study of National Institute of Preventive and Social Medicine (NIPSOM) said, around 80 percent of the Covid-19 patients who died had comorbidity, finds a government study.

Diabetes, lung diseases, and hypertension are the top three comorbidity factors for the death of Covid-19 patients.

22 more die, death toll 5,577

The prevalence of COVID-19 cases in the capital is nearly 10 per cent, but eight in 10 detected cases did not show any symptoms of the coronavirus infection. Fever, cough, sore throat and breathing difficulties are considered symptoms of the infection, but the majority of the COVID-19 cases showing no symptoms.

14 more die, 1,586 new cases found

According to a report of World Health Organisation, COVID-19 cases and deaths are the highest in Dhaka division but the case fatality ratio is the lowest in the division,. The CFR is the highest in Chattogram and Barishal divisions.'

Cases top 4.01 lakh, death toll 5,838

While the number of daily COVID-19 cases decreased in recent weeks, there are still over 77,000 active COVID-19 patients in the country.

The country's foreign exchange reserves are also on the rise due to record amount of remittances, low growth in exports, low import costs and increased foreign aid. But a Daily Star report said, "Hundreds of restaurants in Dhaka closed for good'-situation analysis of restaurant business during pandemic related holidays and present.

- Along with other newspapers, Daily Star published an analytical report on 'IEDCR study report on Covid 19 and Herd immunity. According to that report, '45 percent of the respondents in the capital to be carrying Covid-19 antibody, indicates that residents in some parts of the city may have developed herd immunity'. But Virologist Prof Nazrul Islam said, 'The sample size is not representational. It can be said, but not surely, that some pockets such as slums may be approaching herd immunity. We need to conduct further study with a representative number of samples to know the reality.'
- Daily Star published a write up titled 'Locally tailored policies and improved patient care systems are necessary next steps for Bangladesh during the pandemic', where we learnt a an analysis on Covid 19, measures, impacts and what need to do for handing this. We have a long journey ahead with Covid-19 and "trust" is our safest and strongest boat to sail'.
- Daily Star said in a report on Mental Health issue, which has identified one the major concerns now, 'to improve existing facilities and increase the number of medical graduates who will become therapists and psychiatrists and be recruited to mental health hospitals and wards'.
- Samakal published an article by a Chartered Accountant, in that article tilted 'Corona has opened the door to possibilities'. New Age said in a report, Mandatory mask use mostly ignored across Bangladesh'. which is alarming. Samakal also published a detailed report 'The capacity of the health department to handle the challenges has increased. Despite limitations, Bangladesh's success in tackling corona is promising. Bangladesh has a lower incidence and mortality rate than many developed countries in the world. The recovery rate is also high'.
- Other issues covered by all six newspapers in October are, High Recovery Rate, Deaths from Covid for comorbidity, Asymptomatic case, Antigen test kit, More labortory for Air Travellers, Vaccine (Trial, co financing for trial, Govt Vaccines scheme, Globe Vaccine in WHO list, BANCOVID in Nepal), Corruption and Irregularities, Mental Health (Treatment and Mental health & SDGs), Migrant Workers (Covid test, uncertainty Mental Pressure and Visa), Fear and Preparation for Second wave, Stimulus Package for education institutions and availability of Devices for online education, Pandemic Fallout and Child marriage risks skyrocket, insufficient efforts for Medical Waste Management, withdrawal of Toxic hand-sanitizer and penalty for that company and digital health services.
- Three study reports released by Bangladesh Health Watch, which are: 1. A Quick Assessment of Medicines and other Food items Used by COVID-19 Positive (+ve) Persons at home,' 2. 'Opportunities and Challenges of COVID-19 case handling in Bangladesh,' and 3. 'Sample Collection and Sample Testing for SARS-Co-2 in Bangladesh. Daily Star and Protom Alo highlighted findings of one report with similar title which is. 'Covid patients have to spend Tk 12,000 each for medicine'.

- New Age published a joint statement of Bangladesh Medical Association and Swadhinata Chikitsak Parishad (Swachip) on their position related to recent deputation of Administrative Service cadre officers to health service providing agencies.
- Integrated efforts to face COVID-19 is necessary for facing challenges and it also said 'There is no chance to think that the risk has decreased'.
- Prothom Alo broadcasted live health awareness programmes under sponsorships of different pharmaceuticals and local and international development agencies, majority of those programmes were on female health issues which were menopause, complexities of adolescent pregnancy, women health during corona pandemic, reproductive health of garments workers, birth control after delivery, breast cancer, impact of hypothyroidism on women's health and child marriage; Other issues were safe heart and blood pressure, mental pressure, headache of students, fever during present weather, vaccine, causes of Osteoporosis and prevention, Bangladesh is at the lowest position related to corona test, stroke prevention and suggestions, and free treatment with medicine.
- Prothom Alo published health tips under a section 'Bhalo Thakun (stay well) along with Sushasto (Good Health) and Q &A section on health issues by engaging different experts. Pro Sastho is their weekly special publication on health issues. One of section of this publication was covered readers queries and experts answers on those queries. Issues covered in this month were Heart Disease, Hormone, Ulcers, Arthritis pain, Thyroid, ENT, Digestive system, Gynecology, skin disease, medicine, allergy and urine complexities.
- Bangla Tribune organised and broadcasted on 3 October 2020 a live programme on Family Planning in post delivery situation and maternal health during Covid -19 under a programmae titled 'Boitaki' (Discussion Programm). Maternal services did not stop even during the pandemic. Rather, emphasis has been laid on discouraging pregnancy at this time.
 - Abu Jamil Faisal, a member of COVID-19 advisory committee said, 'Before, 50 percent delivery were done at home, now about 80 percent are being done at home.'
 - Professor Farhana Dewan, Deputy National Co-ordinator of the OGSB Figo PPIUD project said, 'due to the corona, doctors have access to private practice in two ways:
 One is telemedicine and another is post delivery treatment for those who are giving birth child now'.
 - United Nations Population Fund's (UNFPA) SRHR Program Specialist Dr. ASM Hasan said, 'An increase in unwanted pregnancies during the Covid-19 could lead to maternal and child mortality.'

- Professor Parveen Fatima, National Co-ordinator of the Figo PPIUD Project at the Gynecological Society of Bangladesh (OGSB) said, 'At the moment, however, we can no longer stop the treatment. Our main target is to make everyone aware'.
- Daily Star's weekly publication 'Health' covered issues like as Dengue outbreak, a symptom of Covid-19, prostate cancer surgery, weight-loss and standard meals, Scope for massive scale-up of investment in mental health, The adverse effect of overuse of hand sanitizer, Early physical therapy for acute back pain and sciatica improves disability, lifesaving micronutrient to children, incidence of cancer, New electronic survey manual supports countries to combat micronutrient deficiencies, Bariatric surgery tied to longer life expectancy among obese, hope with once-weekly treatment of diabetes, Narcolepsy drugs tied to increased risk for birth defects and updated its guidelines on treating COVID-19.

- Dakatar Achen (weekly publication of Kalerkantho on health issues) also provided mostly health tips which covered Prevention and control of diabetes, Foods to control thyroid, Multisystem inflammatory syndrome in children, Maternal cardiomyopathy, Blood pressure control is important to prevent stroke, Causes of lung problems, lung cancer and Diagnosis of heart problems in the womb.
- Other than Coronavirus issues covered by newspapers, which are, polio vaccines redundant due to negligence, mother and children welfare centres empty as no doctors, staffers appointed yet, controversy related to dress code of Muslim employees in the Institute of Public Health, demanding for independent institution for stopping drug uses, Controversy on New Born Baby in DMCH, where fact was like that doctor declared a baby was dead but later parents found that baby was alive and but DMCH termed this incident as 'no negligence of doctor, but fault', Seasonal fever and Breast cancer risk, misconceptions and prevention.
- Many opinions have been published in October, some opinion leaders are: Md Anik Alam, Senior Scientist, R&D at Pfizer, USA, Dr Selim Raihan, Professor, Department of Economics, University of Dhaka, and Executive Director, South Asian Network on Economic Modeling (SANEM), Anatole Manzi, Deputy Chief Medical Officer in charge of Clinical Quality and Health Systems Strengthening at Partners In Health, Dr Muhammad Morshed, clinical microbiologist and programme head, zoonotic diseases and emerging pathogens, at BC Centre for Disease Control and clinical professor, department of pathology and laboratory medicine, University of British Columbia, Mushtaq Hossain, Consultant, IEDCR, Mahfuz Anam, Editor, Daily Star, Professor Dr. ABM Abdullah, Medicine Specialist and UGC Professor, Dr. Md Nazmul Huda, Public

Health Researcher and *Prabir Purkayastha*, founding editor of Newsclick-a digital media platform. *Hasnat M Alamgir*, Professor of pharmacy, East West University, Bangladesh, *Abdul Malik*, a cardiologist and founder of the National Heart Foundation and Sabbir Ahmed, Chartered Accountant.

- Experts' are unsatisfied on seven months actions for Covid-19 Management but Prime Minister and Health Minister expressed their satisfaction in this regard. According to Samakal report, 'capacity of the health department to handle the challenges has increased'.
- Didn't able to make available Oxygen supply system as planned.
- Reasons behind Less infection in Rohingya camp like as Dhaka slums
- IEDCR study report on Covid 19 and Herd immunity created controversy, experts are not agree with conclusions of that report
- More reports on Mental Health issue; and improvement of existing facilities and increase number of professionals in this field were highlighted.
- As earlier, information on Corruption and Irregularities related to procurement of health department were also available in this month.
- Uncertainties of Migrant Workers related to Covid test, tickets and Vis; and metal pressure were issues of different reports.

- Reopening plan of education institutions and implementation of that plan simultaneously demand for stimulus package for institutions and availability of devices for online education for students were issues in different reports.
- Digital health services and good number of enrolment in this system for getting services were presented.

- Prothom Alo published health tips under a section 'Bhalo Thakun (stay well) along with Sushasto (Good Health) and Q & A section on health issues by engaging different experts. Pro Sastho is their weekly special publication on health issues.
- Bangla Tribune organised and broadcasted a live programme on 'Family Planning in post delivery situation and protecting maternal health during Covid-19 under a programme titled 'Boitaki' (Discussion Programme).
